In 2017, Kaiser Permanente gave more than \$2 billion to provide health services to those who couldn't provide for their own, including children, students, working adults and the elderly.

Our spending helped:

960,000 people who received Kaiser Permanente care through Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program.

270,000 people who received charitable coverage and financial assistance from Kaiser Permanente.

Community and safety-net providers who received grants, training and technical assistance from us.
